Recognizing the growing significance of economics to global security and military strategy, the College incorporated the Economics and National Power course into its core curriculum. This course provides students with an overview of macro-economic concepts, monetary and trade policy, and the opportunities and challenges of globalization, as well as a basic understanding of how these influences shape competition, conflict and strategy. These topics provide the context necessary for a full understanding of U.S. national interests and objectives. The course includes a field study trip to the New York Stock Exchange.
